Key Truth: God loves you more than you love your sin!

Question: Do you love God more than you love your sin?

Three Principles about God's love (Matthew 3:17)

Principle # 1: I Love You!

Principle # 2: I am here with you!

Principle # 3: I am proud of you!

Three Parables (Luke 15)

What is a parable? A parable is, literally, something "cast alongside" something else. Jesus' parables were stories that were "cast alongside" a truth in order to illustrate that truth. His parables were teaching aids and can be thought of as extended analogies or inspired comparisons. A common description of a parable is that it is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning.

- 1. The sheep (Vs. 4-7) Emphasis on the words (rejoicing and joy).
- 2. The silver (Vs. 8-10) Emphasis on the words (rejoicing and joy).
- 3. The son (Vs 11-32) Emphasis on the words (merry, glad) merry means to cheer.
 - a. Sinful younger son (Vs. 12-16)

BIGGEST SIN: He did not love his father like he ought to.

b. Self-Righteous Oldest Son (Vs.25-32)

Biggest Sin: He did not love His father like he ought to.

c. Sacrificing Savior (Vs. 17-24)

Principle: The son should have been shamed but the Father shifted the shame to himself. The Father loved his son more than the son loved his sin.
